

## Matrimony as a sign of divine charity




V. The Lord be with you. R. And with your spir-it.



V. Lift up your hearts. R. We lift them up to the Lord.




V. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. R. It is right and just.




It is truly right and just, our duty and our sal-va-tion, al-ways and




everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and e-




-ter-nal God. For you willed that the human race, created by the gift



of your good-ness, should be raised to such high dig-ni-ty that in




the union of hus-band and wife you might bestow a true im-age
